



## **2024 Annual Report Nominating Committee Report**

March 7, 2025

It is the responsibility of the nominating committee to review the membership list for PAC, establish the requirements of the elder election ballot, and to select name(s) of those people the Lord might be highlighting to be on the election ballot and potentially serve on our board of elders.

Our elders are elected to terms of either one year or two years, with two years being the maximum duration of a term. An elder may be elected to a maximum of three consecutive two year terms, for a maximum serve time of six years at which time an elder must take a mandatory one year sabbatical before being eligible for election again to a new term.

According to our bylaws the elders board must consist of four members at minimum, our elders team and the nominating committee agree that a team of elders should consist of more than four elders to maintain strong governance and representation. A team of six is to be preferred when possible, depending on the election cycle and the willingness/availability of nominees to let their names stand for election.

This year, our election cycle of current board members stands as follows:

Jim Tovell	(finishing a one-year term, no re-election)
Ken Farkash	(midway through second term of two years)
Tim Yaceyko	(finishing his appointment to fulfill the two-year term of Cliff McCauley, eligible for election)
Dave Jeremco	(finishing second term of two years, will not stand for re-election)
Mark Hager	(midway through third term of two years)

Our nominating committee this year was Lyle Brown, Alan Jones, Ken Farkash, Mark Hagar and Scott Whitford. As a team, after praying and reviewing the membership list, we are please to present Phil Tovell and Mark Schommer as our nominees for AGM 2025! Our elder election ballot therefore will include the following:
